






Kay Shaw Nelson



The Munich-based aficionado weaves history and culture with the marvels and mysteries of German beer in this brief, authoritative guide. (Item GER99)




Mary Fulbrook




Joseph E. Persico

With skillful scholarship and engaging style, Wheatcroft reveals the history of this family of eccentric monarchs. (Item AST11)




Robert A. Scott

An enthusiast, Scott delves into the history, design, architecture and wonder of Europe's medieval cathedrals and great Abbey churches. (Item EUR190)




Martin Marty

Twelfth in the series, this thrilling Maisie Dobbs mystery is set in London and Nazi Germany. The Germans have agreed to release a British subject from prison, but only to a family member (who Dobbs must impersonate). Meanwhile, Dobbs' nemesis plans to intercept her. (Item GER365)



Ursula Hegi

Stones from the River, A Novel

1997, PAPER, 525 PAGES, \$16.99

Rich in details of daily life in Germany in the first half of the 20th century, this ambitious novel illuminates the impact of Nazism and complicity of townsfolk through the eyes of Trudi Montag, librarian, storyteller and testimony to difference (she's a Zwerg or dwarf). (Item GER213)



Penelope Fitzgerald

The Blue Flower

2014, PAPER, 320 PAGES, \$14.95

Set in the Age of Goethe, this exquisitely written short novel is a fictional account of the life of the Romantic poet Novalis. It paints a vivid picture of German intellectual and mercantile life in the late 1700s. (Item GER21)
