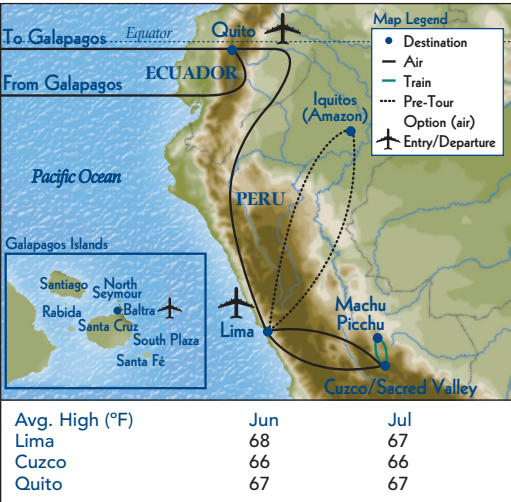

Day 1: Depart U.S. for Lima, Peru We depart today for the Peruvian capital. Upon arrival we transfer directly to our hotel.

Day 2: Lima We meet our tour director and fellow travelers at a briefing, then embark on a tour of colonial Lima and the MALI art museum. Tonight, enjoy a welcome dinner at our hotel. *B,D*

Day 3: Lima/Cuzco/Sacred Valley Arriving in Cuzco today, we stop at the ruins of Sacsayhuamán fortress, a masterpiece of Incan architecture. Then we continue on to Sacred Valley, a region of Inca sites and indigenous villages. We visit the colorful town of Pisac before reaching our hotel late afternoon. *B,L,D*

Day 4: Sacred Valley We begin our day attending a traditional “Offering to the Earth” ceremony. Next we explore Ollantayambo, both a living town and site of massive Incan ruins that still inspire wonder. Then we visit the Incan farming town of Chinchero, where residents live much as their ancestors did and where we see a demonstration of Peruvian weaving. Dinner tonight is at our hotel. *B,L,D*

Day 5: Sacred Valley/Machu Picchu/Aguas Calientes This morning we board a train for the 1½-hour journey to Aguas Calientes, where after lunch we travel by bus for Machu Picchu to embark on our first guided visit of the stunning ruins here. Thanks to the small size of our group, we will be able to move nimbly through the ruins and have the leisure to absorb both the beauty and the mystery of this impressive site. *B,L,D*

Day 6: Machu Picchu/Cuzco This morning, we enjoy our second guided tour of this UNESCO site. Later, we return to Aguas Calientes with some free time before our mid-afternoon train to Cuzco. *B,L*

Day 7: Cuzco Known for its Incan and Spanish colonial heritage, Cuzco is the archaeological “hub” of the Americas and the continent’s oldest continuously inhabited city. This morning, we tour this UNESCO site, which bears the marks of its mixed Inca and Spanish heritage. *B,L*

Day 8: Cuzco/Lima Today we return to Lima, arriving mid-afternoon. After some time to rest and refresh, we reconvene for dinner together this evening. *B,D*

Day 9: Lima/Quito We fly today from one South American capital to another. Nestled in the Andes foothills, Quito boasts many fascinating sites, as we see on our tour that includes the Middle of the World Monument. This evening, we attend a briefing about our Galapagos adventure and then dine on our own. *B,L*

Day 10: Quito/Baltra/Santa Cruz Island Today we fly to the island of Baltra and then transfer to Santa Cruz, our island-based home for our Galapagos exploration. We reach our beautiful hotel set on 370 lush, unspoiled, and secluded acres in the highlands within Galapagos National Park in time for lunch. Then we visit the Charles Darwin Research Station to see and learn about the giant Galapagos tortoises. We dine together tonight at our hotel. *B,L,D*

Day 11: North Seymour Island/Bachas Beach This morning we board the *Santa Fe*, our privately chartered yacht, for North Seymour, a flat, low-lying island with ample opportunities for close encounters with the wildlife on our naturalist-led walk. After lunch, we head back to Santa Cruz island for a nature walk. *B,L,D*

Day 12: South Plaza Island/Punta Carrion Today's destination via our private yacht is the small in size but rich in flora and fauna island of South Plaza, which we reach via private yacht. Boasting abundant wildlife and colorful flora, and surrounded by turquoise waters, South Plaza ranks as one of the most popular (and colorful) of the Galapagos islands. During our nature walk, we are on the lookout for such local residents as land and marine iguanas, bright orange Sally Lightfoot crabs, red-billed tropic birds, Nazca and blue-footed

boobies, and a male colony of sea lions ("the bachelors"). After lunch aboard the *Santa Fe*, we cruise to Punta Carrion, where we have the opportunity to snorkel in the calm waters of a shallow cove. *B,L,D*

Day 13: Santa Cruz Island Today we explore Santa Cruz itself, the second largest of the Galapagos islands. We see the giant Galapagos tortoises in their natural habitat; the huge twin craters of Los Gemelos; and Garrapatero, a secluded white-sand beach where we see an abundance of marine and terrestrial wildlife. *B,L,D*

Day 15: Quito/Depart for U.S. This morning we set out to explore Quito with its well-preserved historic center as we see on our city tour. Highlights include Plaza la Independencia and the 16th-century Monastery of San Francisco. We then enjoy a tour of Quito's Botanical Gardens featuring an orchidarium with more than 1,200 species of orchids; and a visit to Ñaquito Market, a colorful riot of fresh produce and spices. Then we return to our hotel for some leisure time before tonight's transfer to the airport for our overnight flight to the U.S. *B*

Day 16: Arrive U.S. We arrive in the U.S. this morning and connect with our return flights home.

Dartmouth Faculty Leader



Professor John Watanabe, associate professor of anthropology *emeritus*, retired from active teaching in 2023 after thirty years on the Dartmouth faculty. He received his B.A. in anthropology from the University of California, Santa Cruz in 1975, and his Ph.D. in social anthropology from Harvard University in 1984. He continues to research and write on his long interests in how indigenous peoples in Latin America responded to European colonialism to survive as culturally distinct ethnicities today; directing Dartmouth's Foreign Study Program in Anthropology in New Zealand added Māori to the list and a concern for comparative colonialisms across time, space, colonized, and colonizers. He has also written and taught on anthropology of religion and the role of ritual in human social and biological evolution. He bookended his career at Dartmouth receiving the Karen E. Wetterhahn Memorial Award for Distinguished Creative or Scholarly Achievement in 1993 and the Robert A. Fish 1918 Memorial Prize for his contribution to undergraduate education at Dartmouth upon his retirement in 2023. During the trip, Professor Watanabe will lecture on Peru past and present, Machu Picchu in the Inka Empire, the creation of Latin America, and Darwin's theory of evolution by natural selection.
