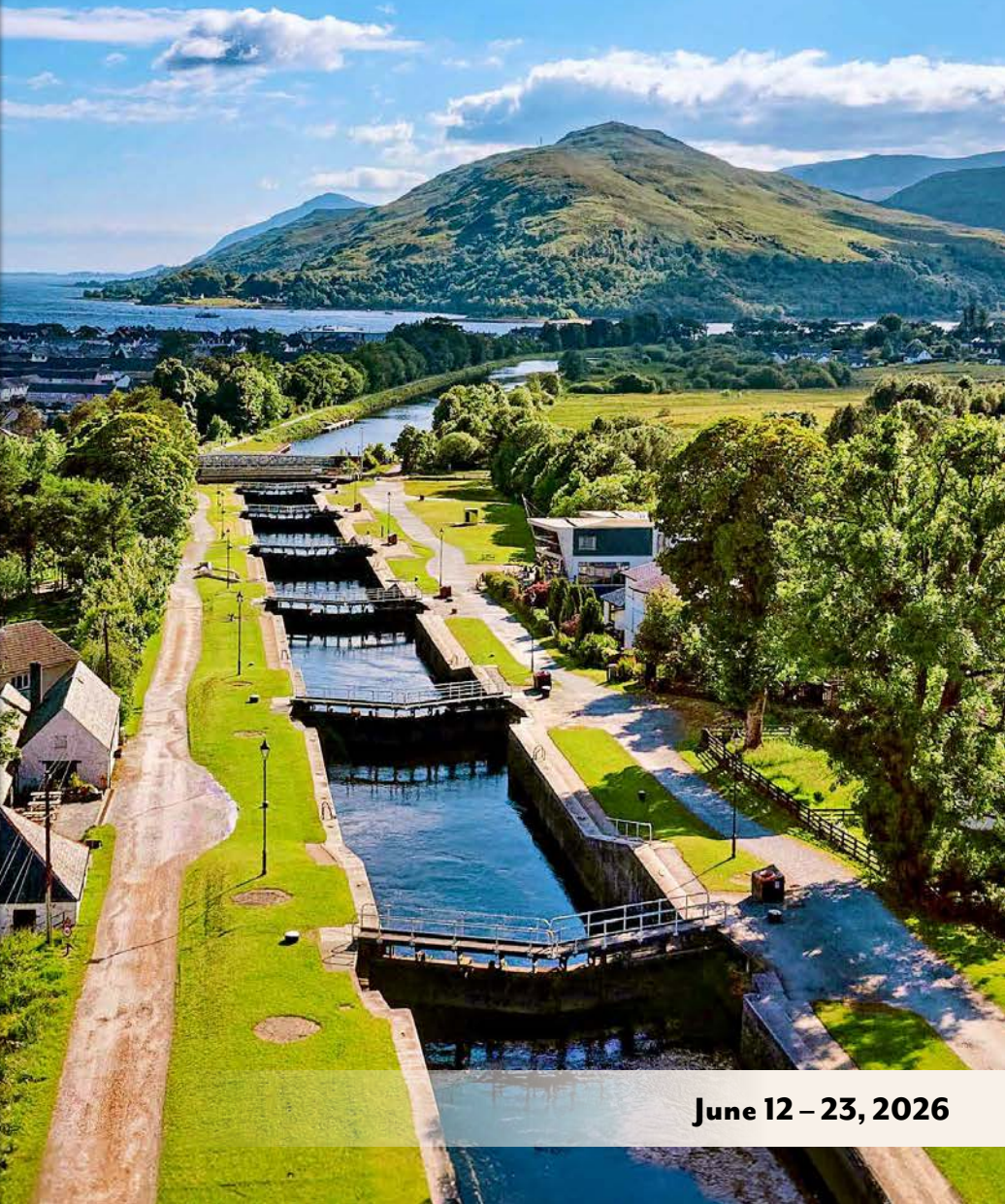

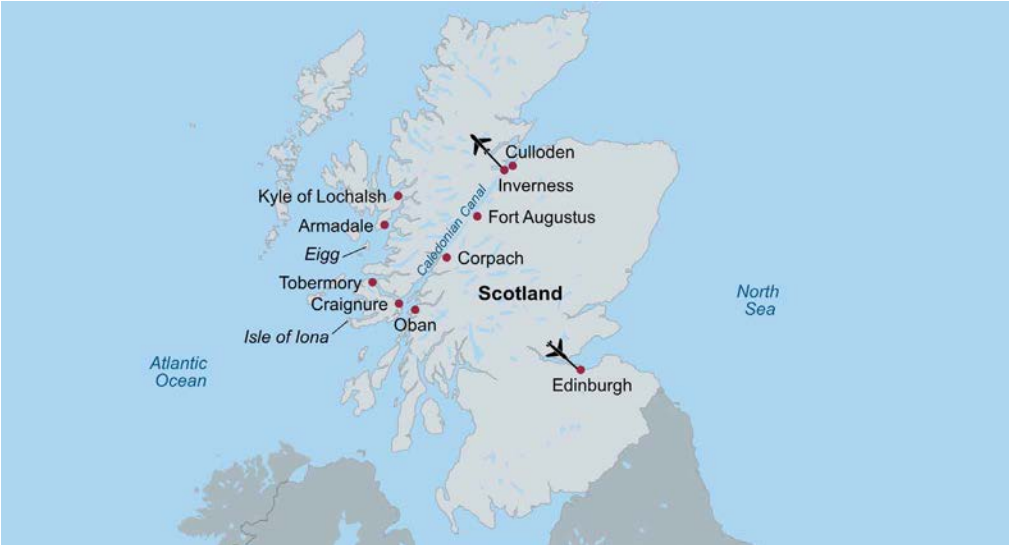

Steve Swayne, the Jacob H. Strauss 1922 Professor of Music at Dartmouth College, teaches courses in: art music from 1700 to the present day, opera, American musical theater, Russian music and American music. He has written two books — “How Sondheim Found his Sound” (University of Michigan Press, 2005) and “Orpheus in Manhattan: William Schuman and the Shaping of America’s Musical Life” (Oxford University Press, 2011; winner of the 2012 ASCAP Nicolas Slonimsky Award for Outstanding Musical Biography). Swayne served as the 2022 president of the American Musicological Society, the premier organization for musicologists in the English-speaking world. He held the 2020 Kluge Chair in Modern Culture at the Library of Congress and received an inaugural Professor John Rassias Faculty Award in 2017 for his exceptional educational outreach to alumni. He specializes in making classical music intelligible to non-musicians and in linking the history of music to larger political, cultural, socioeconomic and historical trends.

Day 1 | June 12

Depart your home city.

Day 2 | June 13 R

Edinburgh, Scotland

Arrive in Edinburgh and transfer to the deluxe *Sheraton Grand Hotel & Spa*. Join your fellow travelers for a Welcome Reception at the hotel this evening.

Day 3 | June 14 B

Edinburgh

On a panoramic tour, explore Old Town, site of the ancient city, which grew up along the route of the Royal Mile. Visit Edinburgh Castle, a majestic landmark and symbol of Scottish strength and power for centuries. Marvel at the glittering Crown Jewels and imposing Mons Meg, a siege cannon of the 1400s. Visit the Scotch Whisky Experience, then spend this afternoon exploring Edinburgh on your own.

Day 4 | June 15 B-L-R-D

Edinburgh | Inverness | Embark
Storied Scone Palace was an ancient gathering place of the

Picts, the site of an early Christian church, and from the ninth century on, the crowning place of the kings of Scotland. Tour the palace and grounds, then savor lunch in a nearby restaurant. In Inverness, embark *Lord of the Glens* and settle in. This evening, enjoy a Welcome Reception and Dinner with entertainment provided by Scottish dancers.

Day 5 | June 16 B-L-D

Inverness | Culloden & Clava Cairns | Ft. Augustus
Visit the battlefield at Culloden, where Bonnie Prince Charlie was dramatically defeated in 1746, and tour the

museum. Next, discover Clava Cairns, a fascinating, well-preserved Bronze Age cemetery. The stones and passage graves here date back 4,000 years. This afternoon, cruise the Caledonian Canal. The ship will ascend an impressive flight of locks at Ft. Augustus, a picturesque village where we will moor overnight.

Day 6 | June 17 B-L-D

Cruising the Caledonian Canal
This morning, we will pass through Loch Oich and picturesque Loch Lochy before encountering the

spectacular Neptune's Staircase. Descending the dramatic series of eight interconnected locks, *Lord of the Glens* will be lowered to sea level — an awesome feat of engineering and a highlight of the cruise. Next, travel by train over the spectacular Glenfinnan viaduct, familiar to Harry Potter film fans as the route of the Hogwarts Express.

Day 7 | June 18 B-L-D

Oban

The ship will cruise to the end of the Caledonian Canal, enter the serenely beautiful waters of Loch Linnhe and sail out to Oban. Disembark and take a walking tour of this charming town, with its

waterfront shops, cafes and cobbled streets. Climb to McCaig's Tower, perched on Battery Hill above the town. Inspired by the Roman Colosseum and made of local granite, the tower affords spectacular views of the Hebrides Islands. After a delicious dinner, indulge in a whisky tasting on board.

Day 8 | June 19 B-L-D

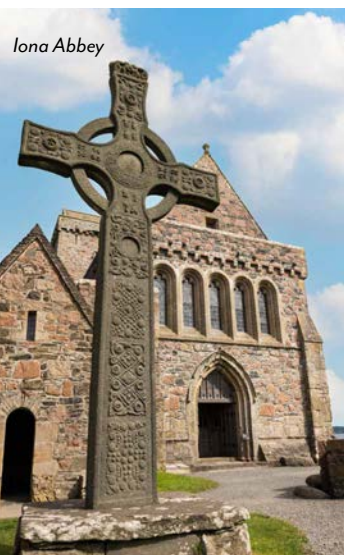
Craignure, Isle of Mull | Isle of Iona

On the emerald-green, teardrop-shaped Isle of Iona, visit Iona Abbey, founded in the year 563 and considered the birthplace of Christianity in Scotland. The abbey is famed as the resting place of some 50 Scottish kings, including Macbeth.

Day 9 | June 20 B-L-D

Tobermory, Isle of Mull | Eigg

The Isle of Mull is well-known for its rugged beauty and marine and bird life. As you disembark in Tobermory, look for eagles diving in the coastal water. Charming, brightly painted houses line the waterfront. Next, visit Eigg, a community-owned island and designated nature preserve. The nutrient-rich waters here support many species of seals, whales and dolphins, and hundreds of seabirds. On a guided tour, search for wildlife — and don't forget your camera! After dinner this evening, the ship sails to Inverie, home of the "most remote pub in mainland Britain" (so says the Guinness Book of

Day 10 | June 21 B-L-R-D

Armadale, Isle of Skye |
Kyle of Lochalsh

Explore the fascinating Museum of the Isles, located near the ruins of Armadale Castle, which is surrounded by 40 acres of woodland gardens. Learn about 1500 years of history and culture in this area — once known as Kingdom of the Isles. Then visit Eilean Donan, one of the world's

most famous castles, located on a tiny island at the confluence of three sea lochs amid some of Scotland's most dramatic scenery. Tonight, join your fellow travelers for a Farewell Reception and Dinner.

Day 11 | June 22 B

Kyle of Lochalsh |
Disembark | Inverness

After breakfast, disembark and transfer to Inverness on a scenic motorcoach drive. Take in rolling hills, lochs and glens as you head east to the

shores of Loch Ness, site of ancient Urquhart Castle. Climb the tower, stroll the remains of the great hall and even peer inside a prison cell. Check in to the first-class *Kingsmill Hotel*, and spend the rest of the day exploring and dining on your own.

Day 12 | June 23 B

Inverness |
Return to Home City

This morning transfer to the airport for your return flight.

Innovative Engineering

During the 1700s, it was quite dangerous and time-consuming for trading ships to circumnavigate Scotland. A vessel leaving Inverness on the country's east coast would sail north through the infamous Pentland Firth with its fearsome currents, then brave the North Atlantic to get to Ft. William on Scotland's west coast. However, there was a natural waterway of sorts — a string of four lochs — cutting through the mountainous Scottish Highlands in the center of the country. In 1801, Thomas Telford conceived of connecting the highland lochs via a human-made canal. It took 20 years for locals to hand-dig (with spades!) the 22 miles of trenches to connect the lochs Dochfour, Ness, Oich and Lochy with each other, and with the sea on either end. The final result featured 29 locks, four aqueducts and 10 bridges along its length. Unveiled in 1822, it was dubbed the Caledonian Canal — an incredible triumph of civil engineering, created in the Victorian age.

LORD OF THE GLENS

At less than 150 feet in length, *Lord of the Glens* was designed to transit the network of locks and canals that cut through the heart of the Scottish Highlands. Every cruise on board *Lord of the Glens* journeys along the hauntingly beautiful Caledonian Canal, known as the Royal Route, following its endorsement by Queen Victoria in 1873. The canal transports guests serenely from Inverness to Fort William, and with only 52 guests on board, the emphasis is not on speed, but on style, while the relaxed and cozy atmosphere harks back to tailor-made travel of the old-fashioned variety.
