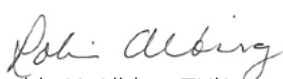

Begin in Kanazawa, a refined coastal city often called a “mini-Kyoto,” known for its preserved samurai and geisha districts, exquisite seafood, and Kenroku-en, one of Japan’s top three landscape gardens. Immerse yourself in Japanese traditions and customs with a traditional tea ceremony or a hands-on workshop crafting delicate wagashi Japanese sweets.

Explore historic castles, from Matsue Castle, featuring Japan’s second largest original wooden keep, to Kokura Castle, the only castle in Fukuoka Prefecture with a main keep. Discover the artistic wonders of Naoshima Island, including a private lecture with celebrated author Pico Iyer, or stroll the paths of Ritsurin Garden, one of Japan’s most exquisite gardens. Marvel at the iconic red torii of Itsukushima Shrine in Miyajima, appearing to float on the sea at high tide, and spend a day in South Korea, visiting Gyeongju, the ancient capital of the Silla kingdom and a UNESCO World Cultural Site.

Along the way savor the flavors of Japanese and Korean Cuisine. At each port, a variety of thoughtfully designed excursions allows you to personalize your journey, from exploring sacred temples and celebrated gardens to visiting contemporary art sites or participating in hands-on activities.

Aboard the all-suite *Island Sky*, every cabin offers sweeping sea views and marble-appointed bathrooms. Enjoy attentive, personalized service from the dedicated crew, dine on international cuisine, relax in the lounges, browse the library, or take in the scenery from the observation deck.

Enhance your voyage with a 2-night pre-extension in Tokyo, or continue with a 3-night post-extension exploring the cities of Nara and Kyoto.

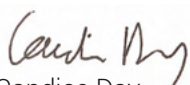

**Michael
Mastanduno**

Michael Mastanduno is the Nelson A. Rockefeller Professor of Government and from 2010 to 2017 served as Dean of the Faculty of Arts and Sciences at Dartmouth College in Hanover, NH. He has taught at Dartmouth since 1987, and his areas of research and teaching include international relations theory, U.S. foreign policy, and the politics of the world economy. His current research concerns the rise of China and its implications for international economics and security. He is author or editor of numerous books including *Economic Containment*; *Introduction to International Relations: Enduring Problems and Contemporary Perspectives*; *International Relations Theory and the Asia-Pacific*; and *International Relations Theory and the Consequences of Unipolarity*. Professor Mastanduno lectures frequently in Europe and Asia and has been a guest faculty member at the University of Tokyo, the Graduate School of Economics and International Relations at Milan, and the Geneva Center for Security Policy, and, most recently, the London School of Economics. He has been awarded fellowships from the Brookings Institution, the Salzburg Seminar, the Council on Foreign Relations, and the East-West Center. He served during sabbatical from Dartmouth as an assistant in the Office of the U.S. Trade Representative. He is a member of the Council on Foreign Relations and Phi Beta Kappa. He also served as Director of Dartmouth's John Sloan Dickey Center for International Understanding, and is the recipient of Dartmouth's Distinguished Teaching Award and the Karen Wetterhahn Memorial Award for Distinguished Scholarly Achievement.

Home/Kanazawa

Depart home on an overnight flight to Komatsu, arriving on April 11. Upon arrival at Komatsu Airport (KMQ), you will be met and transferred to the Hyatt Centric Kanazawa, conveniently located near Kanazawa Station and close to the city's renowned gardens and samurai districts.

This evening, gather for a welcome orientation and dinner at the hotel.

MONDAY, APRIL 12

Kanazawa/Embarkation

Enjoy a choice of full day excursions. Visit the UNESCO World Heritage Site of Shirakawa-go, renowned for its traditional gassho zukuri farmhouses with steeply pitched thatched roofs, or travel to Yamanaka Onsen, set along the scenic Kakusenkei Gorge and long celebrated for its restorative hot springs. Both options include a traditional Japanese lunch.

Embark the *Island Sky* in the late afternoon. This evening, attend the Captain's welcome dinner on board.

TUESDAY, APRIL 13

Kanazawa

After Lecture #1, visit Kenroku-en, one of Japan's most celebrated landscape gardens, known for its winding paths, tranquil ponds, and seasonal beauty. Continue to Kanazawa's preserved samurai district, where narrow lanes and earthen walls reflect life in the Edo period. Enjoy free time for lunch ashore or return to the ship.

In the afternoon, take part in a traditional tea ceremony and visit the 21st Century Museum of Contemporary Art, or join a hands-on wagashi workshop and learn about local arts and crafts.

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 14

Shakaiminato/Matsue

Arrive in Matsue and choose your morning adventure: visit the Adachi Museum of Art, famous for its exceptional Japanese gardens and collection of modern Japanese paintings, or explore Matsue Castle, one of Japan's few remaining original castles, and enjoy free time wandering the charming Samurai Quarter with its traditional streets and historic homes. In the afternoon, relax at sea while attending Lectures #2 and #3.

THURSDAY, APRIL 15

Ulsan/Gyeongju, South Korea

Spend a full day in Gyeongju, the ancient capital of Korea's Silla Kingdom, uncovering its remarkable history and culture. Begin with the Flying Horse Tomb, famed for its intricate carvings, then explore the National Museum to view treasures from Korea's past. Enjoy a traditional Korean lunch before visiting the UNESCO-listed Bulguksa Temple, a stunning example of Buddhist architecture, and experience local cultural entertainment. Attend Lecture #4 during the day.

FRIDAY, APRIL 16

Sasebo

Attend Lecture #5 in the morning before heading out to explore this

lesser-known corner of Nagasaki Prefecture.

Choose between two memorable excursions. Take a scenic cruise aboard a *Kujukushima* sightseeing boat, weaving through 208 islands stretching from Sasebo to Hirado, followed by sweeping views from Tenkaiho Observatory over Sasebo Port and the island-dotted horizon in spring bloom.

Alternatively, take a short boat ride to Hirado Island, where April brings vibrant green terraced rice fields around Kasuga Village. Once a center of early European trade and missionary activity, Hirado preserves this history in its churches and landmarks. During your visit, tour St. Francis Xavier Memorial Church.

SATURDAY, APRIL 17

Shimonoseki

Begin the morning with Lecture #6, followed by a visit to the TOTO Museum to explore the history and innovations behind one of Japan's most iconic companies. Continue to the Mojiko Retro Area, a historic port district known for its preserved early 20th-century architecture and charming streets. In the afternoon, choose your excursion: explore Kokura Castle and its scenic gardens, or venture into the Akiyoshido Limestone Cave, one of Japan's largest cave systems, famous for its dramatic stalactites and stalagmites. This evening, settle in for Lecture #7.

SUNDAY, APRIL 18

Kure/Miyajima

This morning, arrive in Kure and transfer 45 minutes to Hiroshima. Visit Hiroshima Peace Memorial Park and the Hiroshima Peace Memorial Museum, where exhibits provide context for the events of 1945 and the city's commitment to peace. Pause at the Atomic Bomb Dome, a symbol of resilience, and place paper cranes at the Children's Peace Monument in remembrance.

After lunch on board, continue to Miyajima by Zodiac, one of Japan's most celebrated scenic islands. Explore the iconic Itsukushima Shinto Shrine, known for its "floating" torii gate at high tide, and enjoy free time to stroll the streets and browse local shops. Return to the ship and spend the late afternoon cruising the Inland Sea. *Island Sky (B,L,D)*

MONDAY, APRIL 19 Naoshima

Spend the morning on Naoshima Island, touring the remarkable Chichu Art Museum, the

contemporary Benesse House Museum, and the innovative Naoshima New Museum of Art. In the afternoon, join your fellow travelers for the captain's farewell dinner. *Island Sky (B,L,D)*

TUESDAY, APRIL 20 Kobe/Disembarkation/ Home

Disembark in Kobe and transfer by motorcoach to Osaka Itami Airport (ITM) for flights home, or continue your journey with an optional extension to Nara and Kyoto. (B)

PRE-TRIP EXTENSION April 8-11, 2027 • Tokyo, Japan

THURSDAY-FRIDAY, APRIL 8-9 Home/Tokyo, Japan

Arrive at Tokyo Narita (NRT) or Haneda (HND) Airport, where you will be met and transferred as a group to The Prince Park Tower in the heart of Tokyo. This evening, dine at a local restaurant. *The Prince Park Tower (D)*

SATURDAY, APRIL 10 Tokyo

Tour the Tokyo National Museum, home to Japan's finest collection of

art and antiquities, then explore the historic Asakusa district at leisure, including a visit to the iconic Sensoji Temple, Tokyo's oldest and most revered Buddhist temple. *The Prince Park Tower (B,L)*

SUNDAY, APRIL 11 Kanazawa

Start the day with a morning excursion to Tsukiji Fish Market and the Kappabashi Culinary District, where you can experience Japan's vibrant food culture. Afterward,

board the bullet train to Kanazawa, where the main tour begins. (B,L)

POST-TRIP EXTENSION April 20-23, 2027 • Nara and Kyoto

TUESDAY, APRIL 20 Kyoto/Nara

Continue your journey by disembarking in Kobe and traveling to Nara, one of Japan's ancient capitals. Visit the Nara National Museum and Todai-ji Temple, home to the monumental Great Buddha.

Then continue to Kyoto and check in to The Westin Miyako Kyoto, set amid serene gardens with city and mountain views. Conclude the day with dinner at a local restaurant. *Westin Miyako Kyoto (L,D)*

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 21 Kyoto

Visit Tenryu-ji Zen Temple and stroll through the serene Arashiyama Bamboo Grove, an enchanting forest of towering bamboo. Walk beneath the iconic red and orange torii gates of Fushimi Inari Taisha, one of Japan's most celebrated Shinto shrines.

In the afternoon, explore the Miho Museum, known for its striking architecture and extensive collection. The evening is at leisure to relax or explore Kyoto independently. *Westin Miyako Kyoto (B,L)*

THURSDAY, APRIL 22 Kyoto

Visit the UNESCO World Heritage Site Kinkaku-ji (Golden Pavilion) and stroll through its landscaped gardens. Explore the lively Nishiki Food Market, sampling local delicacies along the way.

Enjoy lunch and the remainder of the afternoon on your own to explore Kyoto at your own pace. In the evening, celebrate with a farewell dinner at a local restaurant in the historic Gion geisha district. *Westin Miyako Kyoto (B,D)*

FRIDAY, APRIL 23 Kyoto/Home

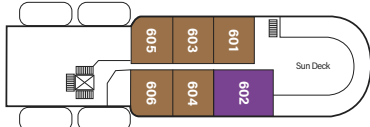

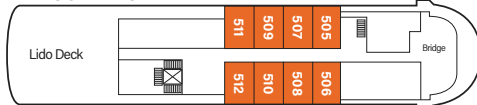
The *Island Sky* is a 59-cabin, all-suite expedition ship. All cabins have an ocean view, en-suite bathroom with marble-topped vanity unit and walk-in shower, sitting area, spacious wardrobe, safe, minibar, individually controlled heat/air-conditioning, television and dressing table. The ship's amenities include complimentary WiFi, a dining room, two lounges with bar service, a small library, an observation deck with comfortable lounge chairs, a hairdresser and laundry service. An elevator services all passenger cabin decks. The *Island Sky's* chefs prepare quality international meals, predominantly Western-style, served at a single open seating. A friendly crew provides exceptional, personalized service, with more than a 1:2 crew-to-passenger ratio. The ship features advanced satellite navigation and communication equipment, roll stabilizers and a fleet of Zodiac landing craft.

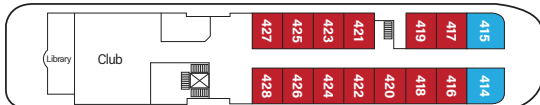

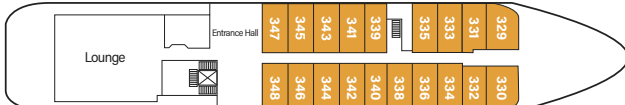

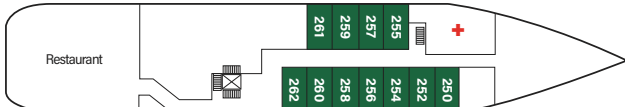

GROUP SIZE:

This program welcomes up to 94 participants, including travelers from Dartmouth Alumni Travel, and co-sponsoring organizations such as Cornell's Adult University, Harvard Alumni Travel, National Trust Tours, and World Affairs Council of Philadelphia.

WHAT TO EXPECT

This is a moderately strenuous program that is, at times, physically demanding and busy. Daily excursions involve up to two miles of walking at a time, often on uneven terrain. In some instances, elevators are unavailable, and stairs may not have handrails. You will be required to remove your shoes while visiting temples, shrines, and a number of other sites. You will need to climb into and out of Zodiacs for an onshore excursion (there will be staff and crew members on hand to assist). Meals are included as noted in the itinerary, with some dinners and a lunch on their own to explore local cuisine independently. Limited medical facilities are available at hotels, and all participants must follow safety and health protocols established by the travel staff, local partners, and host country regulations.

AIR ARRANGEMENTS

U.S. domestic and international airfare is not included in the program rates. Valerie Wilson Travel, Inc. can help with airline arrangements for this trip and can be reached at 877-376-1754. You are also welcome to book your air transportation through your local travel agent, an online travel site, or the airline of your choice. Further information about making flight arrangements will be sent to confirmed participants.

TRAVEL INSURANCE

Travel insurance for trip cancellation and interruption, medical problems, baggage loss and delay, etc., is highly recommended. Trip cancellation policies that apply to this expedition are included in
