Islands of the Indian Ocean aboard the 59-cabin *Island Sky* **NOVEMBER 7-23, 2025**



Dear Alumni, Parents, & Friends of Dartmouth,

THIS IS AN EXTRAORDINARY EXPEDITION for travelers who love the natural world and all its wonders. Located in the heart of the Indian Ocean, the 115 islands that make up the Seychelles are known for crystal-clear waters, endless stretches of powdery white-sand beaches, a diverse and vibrant marine ecosystem, and endemic plant and animal species. Along the way, an experienced team of naturalists will lead guided nature walks and snorkeling among colorful reef fish, interesting coral formations, and various marine creatures.

Your journey starts in Mahé, the largest island in the Seychelles archipelago and home to 90 percent of the country's population. With pristine beaches, lush forests, and dramatic mountains, it is a tropical paradise with a unique culture that blends African, French, and British influences. After two days in Mahé, embark on the 57-cabin *Island Sky* and cruise to the Outer Islands of the Seychelles, then to the remote Alphonse group, and finally to Aldabra, a vast coral atoll that is home to the world's largest population of giant tortoises (over 100,000).

Continue to Madagascar, a thousand-mile island boasting an impressive variety of spectacular landscapes from pristine coral reefs and coastal mangroves to virgin rainforests and native groves of Baobab trees. Geographically isolated for millions of years, nearly all of Madagascar's intriguing animals and plants are found nowhere else on Earth, including nearly 100 varieties of lemurs. Madagascar's people are also unique, having descended from Malay-Polynesian mariners, slaves from Africa, as well as traders from Arabia, India, and Portugal.

This program features 12 days to explore numerous islands and Madagascar's best marine reserves and national parks from the comfortable expedition vessel *Island Sky*, all accentuated by a robust set of lectures from an outstanding team of experts. Travelers will have the option of a post-trip extension near Kruger National Park, South Africa.



Highlights

- Explore the Seychelles and Madagascar in depth from the convenience and comfort of the Island Sky and its fleet of Zodiacs, avoiding the delays and difficulties experienced when trying to explore the country overland.
- Birders will enjoy spotting many different species of birds in the Seychelles, including grey heron, wedgetailed shearwater, sanderling, greater crested terns, frigatebirds, Abbot's sunbirds, crested bulbul, Madagascar fody and more.
- On Praslin Island, explore the UNESCO World Heritage Vallée de Mai, the last remnant of the original high canopied Seychelles palm forest, home to the rare and endangered coco de mer palm tree. It produces the largest and heaviest seed in the world which can weigh up to 40 pounds.
- Look for lemurs up close in their natural habitat, including the red ruffed lemur, and learn about conservation efforts to save these incredible animals.

- Included charter flight from Toliara, Madagascar to Johannesburg, South Africa for onward flights back to the U.S., avoiding the two-day crossing of Mozambique Channel by ship.
- Snorkelers will delight in the diverse marine life they are likely to see, such as Moorish idols, peacock grouper, lyretail grouper, pompano, barracuda, giant clams, blacktip reef sharks, sea cucumbers, batfish, trevally, parrotfish, angelfish, turtles, manta rays, and more.
- Discover Madagascar's remarkable flora and fauna found nowhere else in the world as well as wild landscapes with invaluable biodiversity—the Avenue of the Baobabs has 800-year-old specimens of these magical "upside down trees."
- Meet with local leaders in multiple community-led conservation efforts to protect local species, ecosystems and livelihoods.
- Enjoy the flexibility of optional excursions and walks for all levels so travelers can explore sites at their own pace.





FRIDAY-SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 7-8

Home / Mahé, Sevchelles

Depart the U.S. for Mahé, Seychelles, arriving November 9. NOTE: flight times vary by gateway city; some flights might depart on November 8.

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 9

Mahé, Seychelles

Settle into the Savoy Resort & Spa, located on Beau Vallon Beach, where you'll find elegantly appointed rooms equipped with a private balcony or terrace. Later, gather this evening to meet your fellow travelers at a welcome reception and orientation. SAVOY SEYCHELLES RESORT & SPA (R)

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 10

Mahé

Tour Le Jardin Du Roi Spice Garden, featuring vibrant tropical flowers, fragrant herbs, exotic spices, and medicinal plants, while learning how the Seychelles once stood at the center of the spice trade in the 18th century. Visit the excellent National Museum of History, which offers informative exhibits on Seychellois Creole culture and heritage. Board the Island Sky this afternoon and enjoy the captain's welcome reception this evening before dinner. ISLAND SKY (B,L,D)

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 11

Praslin Island

Spend the morning on Praslin exploring the Vallée de Mai, the last remnant of the original high-canopied Seychelles palm forest. This UNESCO World Heritage Site is home to the endemic and endangered coco de mer palm tree, as well as the rare black parrot. In the afternoon, enjoy a walk along the beach and in the forest on an uninhabited island, followed by an opportunity to snorkel among hawksbill and green turtles. to Johannesburg ISLAND SKY (BLD)

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 12

Alphonse Islands

In the morning, cruise to the three islands of the Alphonse group, located directly south of the Amirantes and considered by many to be the most beautiful of the 115 islands in the Seychelles archipelago. Conditions permitting, call at the idyllic island of Bijoutier, home to a wide variety of seabirds. Snorkel in the crystalclear waters after exploring by foot. ISLAND SKY (B,L,D)

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 13

At Sea

Enjoy a full day at sea to experience the amenities of the ship and attend the lecture series while cruising to the Outer Seychelles Islands. ISLAND SKY (B,L,D)

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 14

Aldabra Group, Outer Seychelles

Visit Aldabra, a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1982 and the world's largest coral atoll, home to the largest population of giant tortoises. This vast atoll consists of a ring of four reef islands surrounding a massive emerald lagoon, with channels linking the lagoon to the ocean. Explore the crystal-clear waters of the lagoon on Zodiacs and snorkel among the Mahé

SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 16

Nosy Hara National Park, Madagascar

Nosy Hara means "mountainous island" in Malagasy and is considered one of the last true paradises of Madagascar. The island features a stunning bay, sandy beaches, and unique, sharply eroded limestone spikes known as Tsingy formations, where you can choose between guided walks. You can hike the shorter Brookesia Micra Circuit in search of animals such as chameleons or take the steeper route on the longer Tsingy Mitsiry Circuit to see the unique Tsingy formations and reach a sweeping viewpoint. Then, relax on a beautiful beach in the afternoon. ISLAND SKY (B,L,D)

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 17

Nosy Tanikely, Madagascar

Morning snorkeling at Nosy Tanikely's marine reserve. Recognized for its outstanding marine biodiversity, the reserve offers some of the best snorkeling in the area, featuring a spectacular coral reef teeming with colorful fish and other sea creatures. In the afternoon, enjoy cruising with time for a lecture. *ISLAND SKY* (B,L,D)

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 18

Mahajanga, Madagascar

Morning visit "Lac Sacre", or Sacred Lake, and learn about the significance of clear waters and special trees planted on the lakeshore; walk through nearby mango trees to observe the sifaka lemurs, iguanas, lizards, and colorful birds that reside there. Afternoon chance to swim at a beachside resort before returning to the ship. ISLAND SKY (B,L,D)

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 19

At Sea

During a day at sea, enjoy the continuation of the education program and the amenities of the *Island Sky* as it cruises. *ISLAND SKY* (B,L,D)

THURSDAY, NOVEMBER 20

Morandava, Madagascar

Zodiac to shore with a choice of excursions for an Avenue of Baobabs walk, followed by a specially arranged visit to the Zazamalala Forest Reserve and Botanical Garden. Established in 2000, the reserve's staff harvest seeds as part of an extensive community reforestation effort and run a turtle breeding program. During a forest walk, observe and learn about the 11 species of lemurs, 5 species of chameleons, and numerous rare bird species that reside here. *ISLAND SKY* (B,L,D)

FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 21

Toliara, Madagascar

Today, visit the curious spiny forest region, a unique ecosystem found only in the southern part of Madagascar, and view the spectacular baobab trees at Reniala Private Reserve. The reserve is a paradise for birds and is home to the grey mouse lemur, radiated tortoise, and warty chameleon. Enjoy the captain's farewell reception and dinner this evening. *ISLAND SKY* (B,L,D)

SATURDAY, NOVEMBER 22

Toliara, Madagascar / Disembark

Start with breakfast, followed by a guided visit to Antsokay Arboretum, which protects 900 species of endemic plants. Transfer to the airport for a charter flight to Johannesburg, South Africa, for onward flights back to the U.S. (B,L)




Island Sky

The Island Sky is a 59-cabin, all-suite expedition ship. All cabins have an ocean view, en-suite bathroom with marble-topped vanity unit and walk-in shower,

sitting area, spacious wardrobe, safe, minibar, individually controlled heat/air-conditioning, flat-screen television and dressing table. The ship's amenities include complimentary WiFi, a dining room, two lounges with bar service, a small library, an observation deck with comfortable lounge chairs, a hairdresser and laundry service. An elevator services all passenger cabin decks. The *Island Sky*'s chefs prepare quality international meals, predominantly Western-style, served at a single open seating. A friendly crew provides exceptional, personalized service, with more than a 1:2 crew-to passenger ratio. The ship features advanced satellite navigation and communication equipment, roll stabilizers and a fleet of Zodiac landing craft.

WHAT TO EXPECT We consider this to be a moder-

ately strenuous program, at times physically demanding and busy, with considerable walking at some destinations. Daily activities can involve up to two miles of walking, unaided, over varied terrain (e.g., uneven beaches, steep and sandy or muddy trails, dirt streets and paths in small villages), in hot or rainy conditions. You will need to climb into and out of Zodiacs for most excursions. Please note that some locations involve wet landings. All participants who plan to swim or snorkel must be comfortable swimming unassisted in open water, although no prior snorkeling experience is necessary. Participants must be physically fit, active and in good health.
