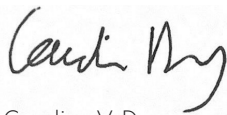

Jesse Casana is an archaeologist whose research investigates settlement and land use history, the emergence and development of complex societies and the dynamic interactions of humans with their environment. Casana's projects explore large regions, embrace long periods of human history and employ a wide range of geospatial technologies. He has conducted field projects throughout the Middle East, including in Iraq, Syria and Dubai, and more recently in Antarctica, the Pacific and across the United States. Professor Casana established and directs Dartmouth's Spatial Archaeometry Lab (SPARCL), a research group dedicated to developing innovative approaches to archaeological remote sensing using satellite imagery, drone-based sensors, terrestrial geophysics and underwater mapping technologies.

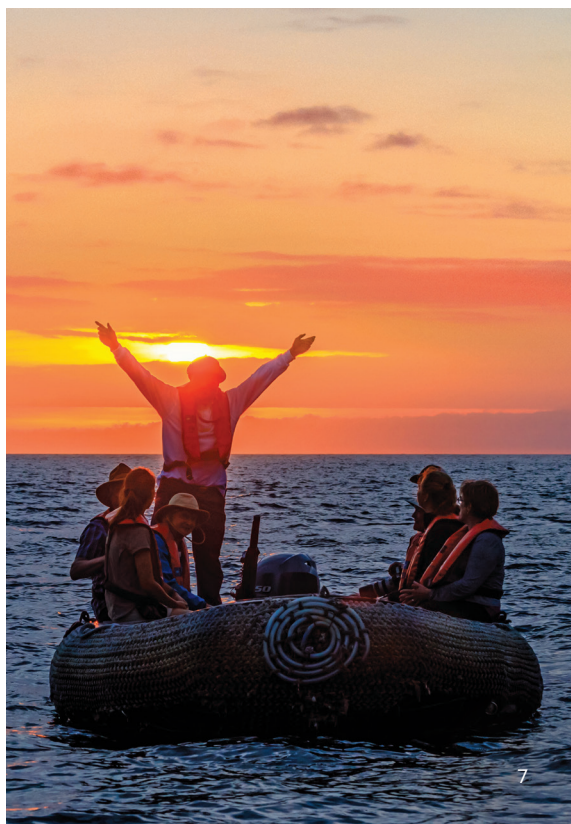


Take Great Photos with the Pros

Itinerary

Pack a lifetime of adventure into one action-filled week. Explore the legendary Galápagos Islands with daily opportunities for walks, hikes, kayaking, stand-up paddleboarding and snorkeling.



DAY 1: QUITO OR GUAYAQUIL, ECUADOR

Arrive in Guayaquil and transfer to the Hotel del Parque, a tranquil haven set in a restored 19th-century building.

Note: For those preferring to fly into Quito, Ecuador's capital, please note the city sits at a 9,350ft elevation. This is an alternative option to Guayaquil, at no additional cost and is recommended if guests take advantage of an optional extension.

DAY 2: QUITO OR GUAYAQUIL/GALÁPAGOS/EMBARK

This morning, fly to Baltra in the center of Galápagos (required flights at an additional cost), a little world unto itself in the tropical Pacific Ocean. Get to know your naturalists as you begin your exploration of the islands and their diverse wildlife. (B,L,D)

DAYS 3-6: EXPLORING THE GALÁPAGOS

Your expedition begins and ends in Baltra and includes visits to a careful selection of diverse islands. Our itinerary offers an optimal balance of wildlife, landscapes and experiences. All itineraries are subject to Galápagos National Park regulations. Here is a sample of islands you may visit during your expedition. (B,L,D Daily)



BARTOLOMÉ

Climb the steps to the summit of this 300-foot volcanic wonderland for stunning views. Explore, swim and snorkel from the beach. Catch a glimpse of Galápagos penguins, one of the world's rarest penguin species.

SAN CRISTÓBAL

Search for red-footed boobies and the endemic mockingbird and lava lizard—found only on this easternmost island. Explore Baquerizo Moreno, where sea lion colonies thrive in the middle of town.

ESPAÑOLA

In this birding paradise, see swallow-tailed gulls, Española mockingbirds and, seasonally, the world's only population of waved albatross. Keep an eye out for vividly colored marine iguanas, and walk amid sea lions on a white-sand beach.

FERNANDINA

One of the most active oceanic volcanoes in the world, Fernandina is the youngest and most pristine island in Galápagos—and home to the strange flightless cormorant, Galápagos penguins and the largest marine iguanas. On shore, we hike across impressive recent lava flows.

SANTA CRUZ

Explore Puerto Ayora, the largest town and headquarters of both the Charles Darwin Research Station and Galápagos National Park. Head to the lush, green highlands to see giant tortoises roaming in the wild.

DAY 7: GALÁPAGOS/DISEMBARK/QUITO OR GUAYAQUIL

After breakfast, disembark the ship and fly to Quito or Guayaquil. (B)

DAY 8: QUITO OR GUAYAQUIL

Stay and relax or take an early flight home today. (B)

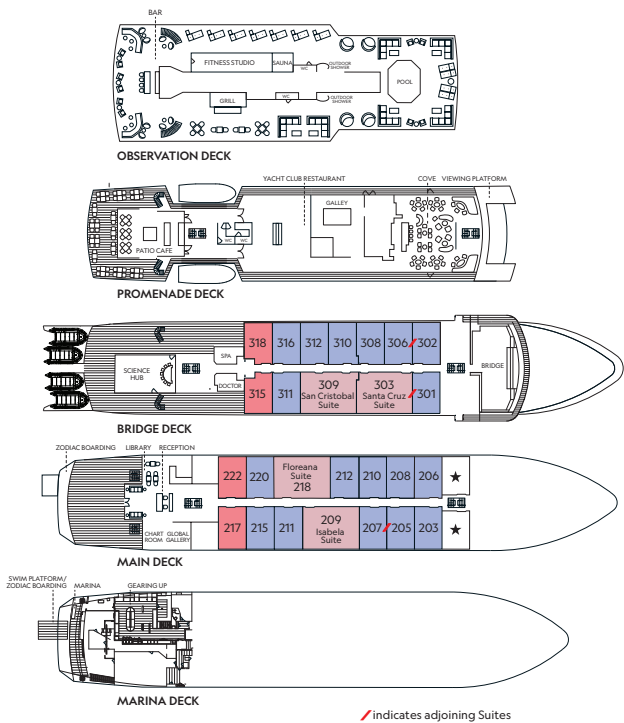
