Day 1 | Sep. 9

Depart for an overnight flight to Athens, Greece.

Day 2 | Sep. 10 **L-D**

Athens, Greece | Embark

Arrive in Athens, transfer and embark the comfortable and intimate *Wind Spirit*.

Day 3 | Sep. 11 **B-L-R-D**

Delos | Mykonos

Your journey begins at the UNESCO World Heritage site of Delos — the legendary birthplace of Artemis and Apollo. Walk along the Sacred Way to the Sanctuary of Apollo, a spectacularly rich archaeological site with remains of three separate temples from the fifth and sixth centuries B.C. See the legendary Terrace of the Lions, dedicated to Apollo, where hand-carved marble statues guarded the island for nearly 2,600 years. After lunch on the ship, set off to explore Mykonos at your own pace. According to ancient legend, its craggy hills and clefts were formed from the

petrified bodies of giants defeated by Hercules.

Join friends for the Captain's Welcome Reception tonight.

Day 4 | Sep. 12 **B-L-D**

Kusadasi, Turkey | Ephesus

Arrive in Kusadasi and drive to Ephesus, an archaeological site of Greek, Roman and Byzantine ruins, including the restored and reconstructed Celsus Library and the Great Theater. Visit the Terrace Houses and the Ephesus Archaeological Museum, which showcases artifacts that were retrieved from Ephesus during excavations in the late

19th and early 20th centuries. Continue to the Nakkas Weaving Center to witness a cocoon silk demonstration.

Later, at the Caravansera, enjoy a Sema ceremony where dervishes perform a symbolic whirling dance.

Day 5 | Sep. 13 **B-L-D**

Pátmos, Greece

On the island of Pátmos, tour the Greek Orthodox Monastery of Saint John the Theologian, a UNESCO World Heritage site. See the Cave of the Apocalypse, where Saint John the Apostle most likely wrote the Book of Revelation in A.D. 95.

Return to the ship for lunch and a culinary demonstration. This afternoon, learn about life on the island during a discussion with residents.

Day 6 | Sep. 14 **B-L-D**

Rhodes | Lindos

Begin in the UNESCO-listed city of Rhodes at its ancient port where the mighty Colossus of Rhodes statue stood before an earthquake in the third century B.C destroyed it. Explore the medieval old town, built by the Order of St. John, which occupied Rhodes from the early 14th century through

the 16th century. Visit the Palace of the Grand Masters, a formidable Gothic castle that houses a treasure trove of art, furniture and icons from that era.

Return to the ship for lunch, followed by an afternoon at leisure. Those looking for an active afternoon may join a walking tour to the Acropolis of Lindos, an iconic site with breathtaking views.

Enjoy a traditional Greek folklore show with local musicians and dancers, followed by dinner tonight.

Day 7 | Sep. 15 **B-L-D**

Santorini

Be on deck as your ship glides to breathtaking Santorini, one of the most iconic islands in the Aegean Sea. You'll be greeted by stunning whitewashed buildings perched above the sea and a caldera rising dramatically from the water. Some believe this location was the inspiration for the legendary lost city of Atlantis. From the port, drive to the southern end of the island to explore the prehistoric settlement of Akrotiri. Tour these

spectacular Minoan ruins, held intact by layers of pumice and ash for over 3,500 years.

Continue to Fira, renowned for its whitewashed buildings, stunning views and vibrant energy. During time at leisure in Fira, take a look at the famous Three Bells of Fira with its iconic blue dome.

Day 8 | Sep. 16 B-L-R-D

Milos

This largely undeveloped volcanic island in the East



Cyclades is known for its abundant sandy beaches and stunning topography. It was here that the world-famous Venus de Milo marble statue was found in pieces in 1820. Though most of it was reassembled and presented to King Louis XVIII, the arms of the ancient female figure believed to represent Aphrodite were never found. Visit the Archaeological Museum of Milos, which features exhibits from the Neolithic period through late antiquity. Return to the ship for lunch.

After, take advantage of your final afternoon at leisure to spend time on the beach or enjoy a refreshing swim.

Attend a Captain's Farewell Reception and Dinner this evening. Raise a toast to celebrate your adventure!

Day 9 | Sep. 17 B

Athens | Disembark |
Return to Home City

Arrive in Athens. Disembark and transfer to the airport for your return flight home.

Legends of Ephesus

Ancient Ephesus is a city of stories, ones that trace from as far back as 1050 B.C. through the Roman Imperial era to the age of early Christian evangelism. A port city and center of trade on the Mediterranean for millennia, its first settlers were Anatolian people were later captured by Ionian tribes, who were unseated by the Persians, who were then conquered by legendary Greek leader Alexander the Great. However, most of the well-preserved ruins you will see today in this UNESCO-inscribed Turkish city are remnants of an age of extreme wealth and prosperity enjoyed under the first-century reign of Caesar Augustus. As the new capital city of the Roman Empire, the Hellenistic Great Theatre was renovated with lavish Roman aesthetics; the grand, two-story Library of Celsus was constructed; and elaborate villas known as the Terrace Houses were built for its most elite residents. Very close to Ephesus, you may also see what remains of the Temple of Artemis, one of the "Seven Wonders of the Ancient World." This temple to the goddess Artemis, built in the sixth century B.C., was set on fire, then rebuilt several times, only to be destroyed by a Christian mob around A.D. 401. Believing that the Virgin Mary lived here after the death of Jesus, Ephesus has since become a site of Christian pilgrimages that continue to this day.
