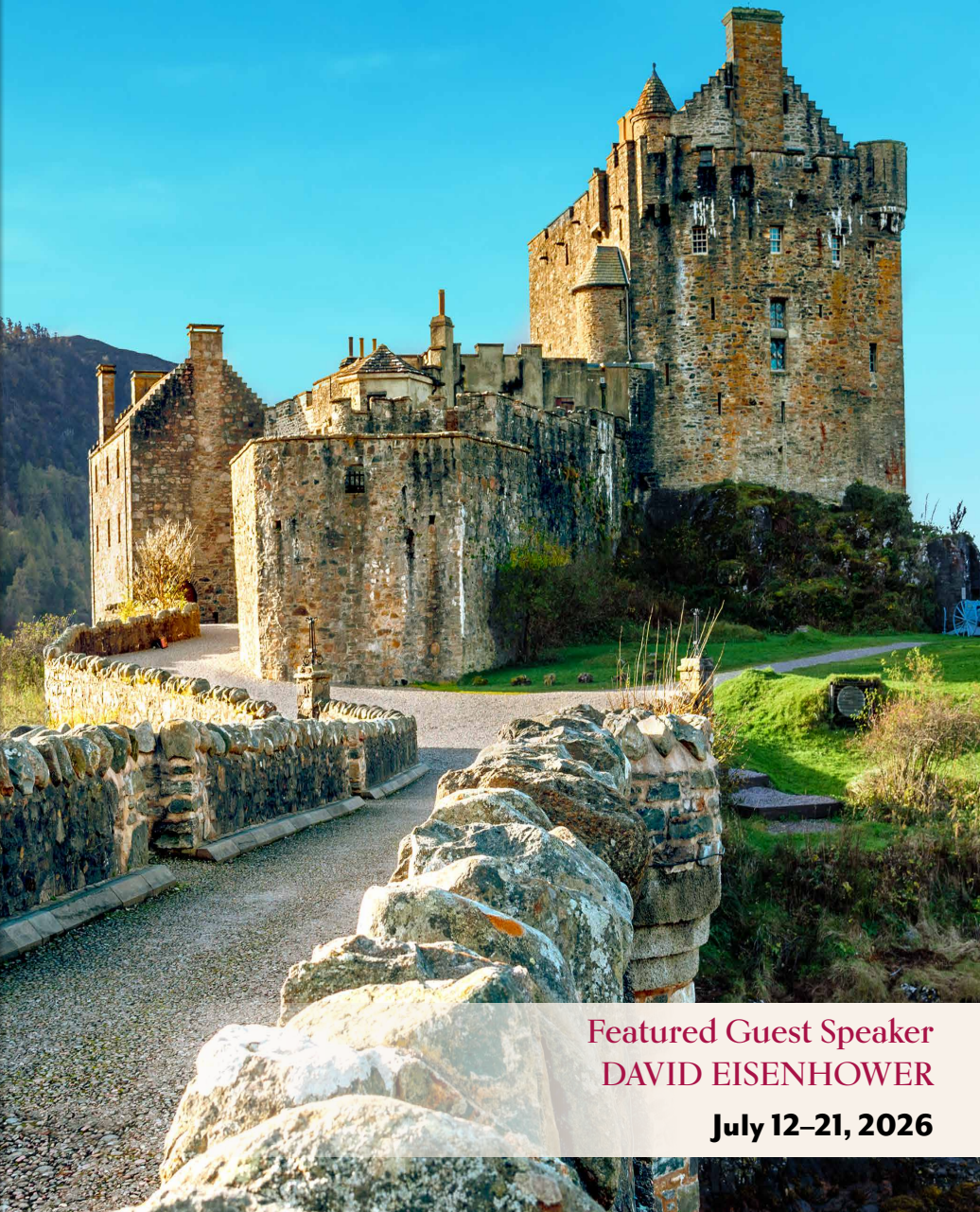

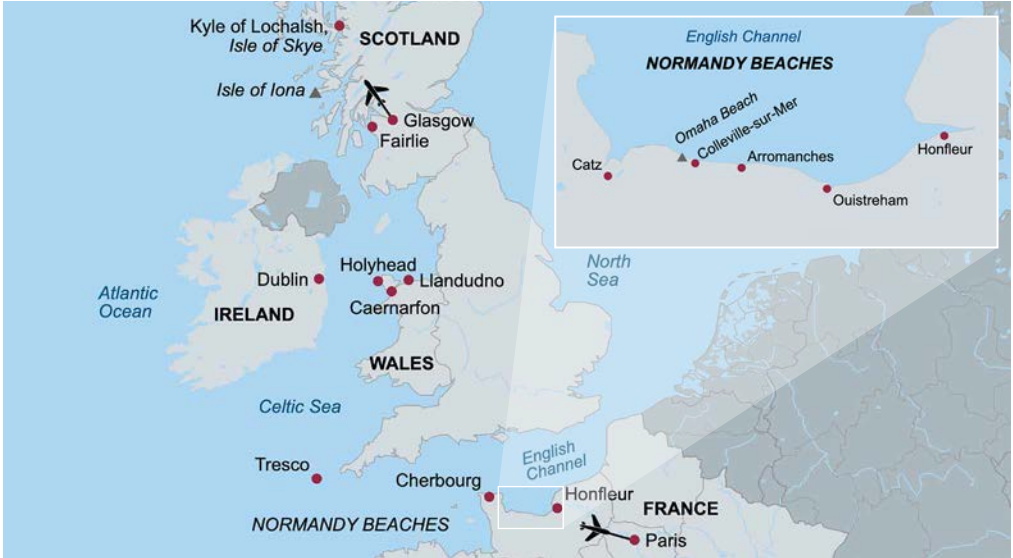

Susan Ackerman is the Preston H. Kelsey Professor in Religion, Professor of Women's and Gender Studies, and Professor of Jewish Studies at Dartmouth College. She joined the Religion Department in 1990 after teaching at the University of Arizona and at Winthrop College in South Carolina. She is a specialist in the religion of ancient Israel and the religions of Israel's neighbors (Mesopotamia, Egypt, and Canaan), an interest she first developed as an undergraduate religion major at Dartmouth (A.B., 1980) and continued to explore in graduate school at Harvard (M.T.S., 1982; Ph.D., 1987). In 2006, Professor Ackerman won the Dartmouth College Faculty Award for Service to Alumni Continuing Education, and in 2018, she was awarded the Dartmouth College Alumni Council's Professor John Rassias Award for Faculty Commitment to Lifelong Learning.

Day 1 | July 12

Depart your home city for an overnight flight to Paris, France.

Day 2 | July 13

D

Paris, France | Honfleur | Embark

Arrive in Paris, transfer to Honfleur and embark the deluxe *Ocean Victory*.

After settling in your cabin, take time to explore. Meet new friends during your first dinner as the ship departs.

Day 3 | July 14

B-L-D

Ouistreham | Arromanches | D-Day Sites | Pointe du Hoc

Enjoy a buffet breakfast before departing for a full day of exploration. Begin in Arromanches for free time to spend as you wish. At the Normandy American Cemetery and Memorial in Colleville-sur-Mer, join David Eisenhower to contemplate the solemn commemorative crosses and Stars of David. Then, walk the landmark Normandy shores at Omaha Beach, the code name for this section of the coast where

Allied forces landed. Canadian travelers may choose to visit Juno Beach and the Bény-sur-Mer Canadian War Cemetery. Continue to Pointe du Hoc, a promontory with a 100-foot cliff overlooking the English Channel on the coast of Normandy. Hear how the U.S. Army Ranger Assault Group scaled the cliffs to capture this critical Nazi stronghold.

Day 4 | July 15

B-L-R-D

Cherbourg | Catz | Angoville au Plain | Utah Beach | Sainte-Mère-Église

Another enriching day of touring Normandy's poignant D-Day sites awaits. Begin at

the Utah Beach Landing Museum for a comprehensive look at the D-Day battle from planning to its execution. Continue to Catz to visit the Church of Angoville au Plain, where two U.S. Army medics used to treat both American and German injured soldiers. Relax over lunch at a local restaurant near the Normandy Victory Museum; then drive to Sainte-Mère-Église, said to be the first town liberated by Allied troops on D-Day. Learn about the events of that day and see key landmarks. Our next stop is Azeville. The Azeville Battery was a World War II German artillery position located near the





village of Azeville in the Manche department of Normandy, northwestern France.

Return to the ship and gather for a Captain's Welcome Reception tonight.

Day 5 | July 16 **B-L-D**

Tresco, Scilly Isles, England
Join David Eisenhower for an insightful lecture this morning. Set off to discover the lovely Tresco Abbey Gardens. Though it is just 28 miles off the Cornwall coast, its unique climate makes it the ideal location for tropical and subtropical plants, such as

succulents, palm trees, king protea and more. You may also see colorful golden pheasants and red squirrels during your garden visit.

Gather with friends, new and old, for dinner this evening.

Day 6 | July 17 **B-L-D**

Holyhead, Wales

Arrive in Holyhead and savor a hearty lunch before setting off on your chosen excursion. You can select to visit the UNESCO-listed medieval Caernarfon Castle or treat your senses to the world-famous Bodnant Gardens, a haven of glorious colors and lily ponds.

A Welsh choir provides tonight's entertainment.

Day 7 | July 18 **B-L-D**

Dublin, Ireland

Get acquainted with friendly Dublin. Admire the city's sights and highlights, including St. Patrick's Cathedral. Visit Trinity College to see the legendary Book of Kells, the beautiful, illuminated manuscript created by medieval monks. Take advantage of time at leisure to make your own discoveries in Dublin. Perhaps visit a local pub for a pint or stroll down George's Street. Enjoy an engaging performance of traditional Irish music and dancing before dinner.

Day 8 | July 19

B-L-D

Iona, Scotland

Dig into a satisfying breakfast as the ship approaches Iona in Scotland’s Inner Hebrides. Gain insight into a sacred and enduring symbol of worship at Iona Abbey, founded in the year 563 and considered the birthplace of Christianity in Scotland. The monks of Iona spread Christian ideas across Scotland and the north. St. Martin’s Cross still stands by the roadside, and a replica of St. John’s Cross is found by the doorway.

Day 9 | July 20

B-L-R-D

Kyle of Lochalsh

Today’s excursion showcases Eilean Donan Castle, one of Scotland’s most celebrated fortresses. Eilean Donan sits at the confluence of Loch Alsh, Loch Long and Loch Duich on a tiny tidal island. Cross a stone bridge and admire the view. The original castle lay in ruins after the Jacobite Rising of 1719 until a British army officer purchased it in 1911. He reopened it to visitors in 1932 after a years-long restoration project. After lunch on the ship, join a scenic tour of the Isle of Skye.

See the Cuillin, a range of starkly beautiful mountains with jagged peaks. Upon arrival in Portree, enjoy free time to explore the island’s charming main town. Celebrate your adventure at tonight’s Captain’s Farewell Reception, followed by dinner.

Day 10 | July 21

B

Fairlie | Disembark | Return to Home City

This morning, the ship arrives in Fairlie. After breakfast, transfer to the airport for your return flight home.

DWIGHT DAVID EISENHOWER II

His 1986 bestseller, “Eisenhower: At War 1943–1945,” was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize in History. Eisenhower received a B.A. in history cum laude from Amherst College. Following graduation, he served in the United States Naval Reserve for three years as an officer on the *USS Albany*; shortly afterward, he earned his J.D. cum laude from The George Washington University Law School. Today, Eisenhower is Senior Fellow of the Foreign Policy Research Institute and a Public Policy Fellow at the Annenberg School of Communication and the School of Arts and Sciences at the University of Pennsylvania, where he teaches “Communication and the Presidency.”

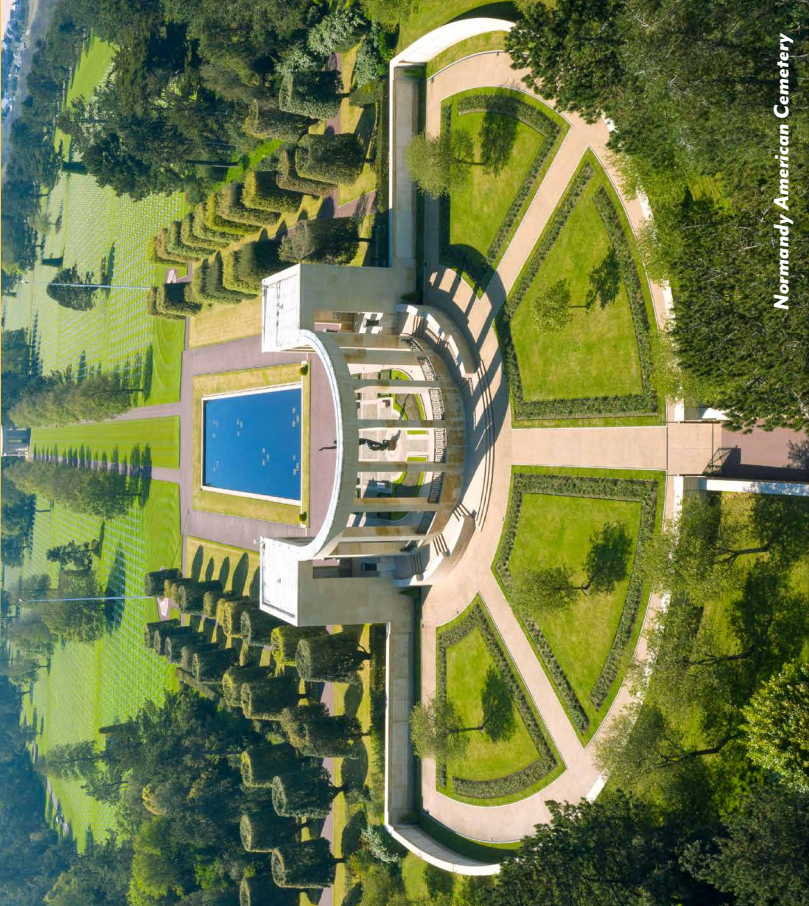
