Robert Bonner, the Kathie Tappe Vernon Professor in Biography and Professor in the History Department since 2009, researches and teaches primarily on nineteenth-century North American history. An expert on the 1860s crisis of Union and emancipation, among his books are *Mastering America: Southern Slaveholders and the Crisis of American Nationhood* and a forthcoming text on the international dimensions of Confederate meaning-making.



Leslie Butler, Associate Professor of History and Vice Chair of the department, studies and teaches courses on American cultural and intellectual history that explore the contours and complexities of 19th-century Anglo-American liberalism. Her first book, *Critical Americans: Victorian Intellectuals and Transatlantic Liberal Reform*, examines a group of liberal intellectuals of the time who sought to remake public life, and her most recent book *Consistent Democracy: The "Woman Question" and Self-Government in Nineteenth Century America* explores debates on how women's roles in society shaped 19th-century political thought.

PROFESSOR DAVID EISENHOWER

Grandson of General and President Dwight D. Eisenhower, Professor David Eisenhower is a noted historian of World War II and the Cold War. His 1986 bestseller, *Eisenhower: At War 1943–1945*, was a finalist for the Pulitzer Prize in History. Eisenhower received a B.A. in history cum laude from Amherst College. Following graduation, he served in the United States Naval Reserve for three years as an officer on the USS Albany; shortly afterward, he earned his J.D. cum laude from The George Washington University Law School. Today, Eisenhower is Senior Fellow of the Foreign Policy Research Institute, and a Public Policy Fellow at the Annenberg School of Communication and the School of Arts and Sciences at the University of Pennsylvania, where he teaches “Communication and the Presidency.”



ALLEN PACKWOOD OBE

Director of the Churchill Archives Centre and a Fellow of Churchill College, Cambridge, England, Allen Packwood OBE, B.A., M. Phil. (Cantab), F. R. Hist. S., was co-curator of “Churchill and the Great Republic,” a Library of Congress exhibition, and of “Churchill: The Power of Words,” a display at the Morgan Library in New York. He is the author of *How Churchill Waged War*, has lectured extensively on Sir Winston Churchill, and organized a 2009 conference titled “The Cold War and its Legacy”—attended by senior representatives from China, Germany, Romania, the Russian Federation, and the U.S.

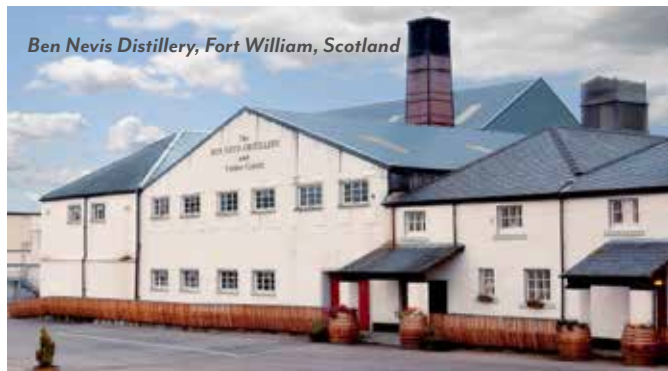

Day 6

Day 5

Visit the world-class Bodnant Garden. Its 80 acres of formal gardens, woodland, and meadows feature botanical collections from around the world, and exotic and rare plants and trees. Venture farther into the Welsh countryside for lunch and an unforgettable Welsh Choir performance. Then, experience the grandeur of the UNESCO World Heritage-designated Caernarfon Castle, a 13th-century fortress built

the Book of Kells, and grand O'Connell Street, lined with statues of Irish statesmen. Explore more of Dublin during free time and experience a traditional Irish music and dance presentation by the Merry Ploughboys. (B,L,D)

Day at Sea

Day 7

The ship sails from Dublin to Cherbourg, France. Join Professor David Eisenhower II, who shares personal stories from his grandfather and Operation Overlord—the Allies' code name for the military campaign that launched the



D-Day invasion at Normandy on June 6, 1944. (B,L,D)

Utah Beach/Sainte-Mère-

Day 8

Visit the Utah Beach D-Day Museum, built on the very beach where the first American troops landed on June 6, 1944. Immerse yourself in the chronological recounting of D-Day in ten sequences. In Sainte-Mère-Église, one of the first French villages to be liberated by American forces during World War II, see the town and its famous church, and hear the story of American soldier John Steele. After lunch, visit Pointe du Hoc, a promontory with a 100-foot cliff overlooking the English Channel on the coast of Normandy. Hear how the U.S. Army Ranger Assault Group

scaled the cliffs to capture this critical Nazi stronghold. (B,L,D)

**Honfleur/Caen, France/
Omaha Beach/Normandy**
Day 9

Travel to Longues-sur-Mer to see the coastal German artillery battery and historic monument. Visit Omaha Beach, the code name for this section of the coast, where Allied forces landed, to walk the historic Normandy shores. At Colleville-sur-Mer, in the company of Professor, Eisenhower, contemplate the solemn commemorative crosses and Stars of David in the Normandy American Cemetery and Memorial. Canadian travelers can visit the Juno Beach Bény-sur-Mer Canadian War Cemetery. Conclude your evening with the Captain's Farewell Reception and Dinner on board with your fellow travelers. (B,L,R,D)

**Portsmouth, United
Kingdom/Disembark ship**

Day 10

After disembarking, take a guided visit to the Portsmouth D-Day Story museum. View the Overlord Embroidery, illustrating the history of Operation Overlord in 34 panels. Enjoy lunch at Portsmouth Guildhall with a lecture by Andrew Roberts, author of *Churchill: Walking with Destiny*. Travel to Southwick House, a Georgian manor house, to explore General Eisenhower's D-Day operation headquarters. Transfer to London and check in to the hotel. (B,L,D)

Following breakfast, continue on the Post-Program Option or transfer to the London for your return flight home. (B)

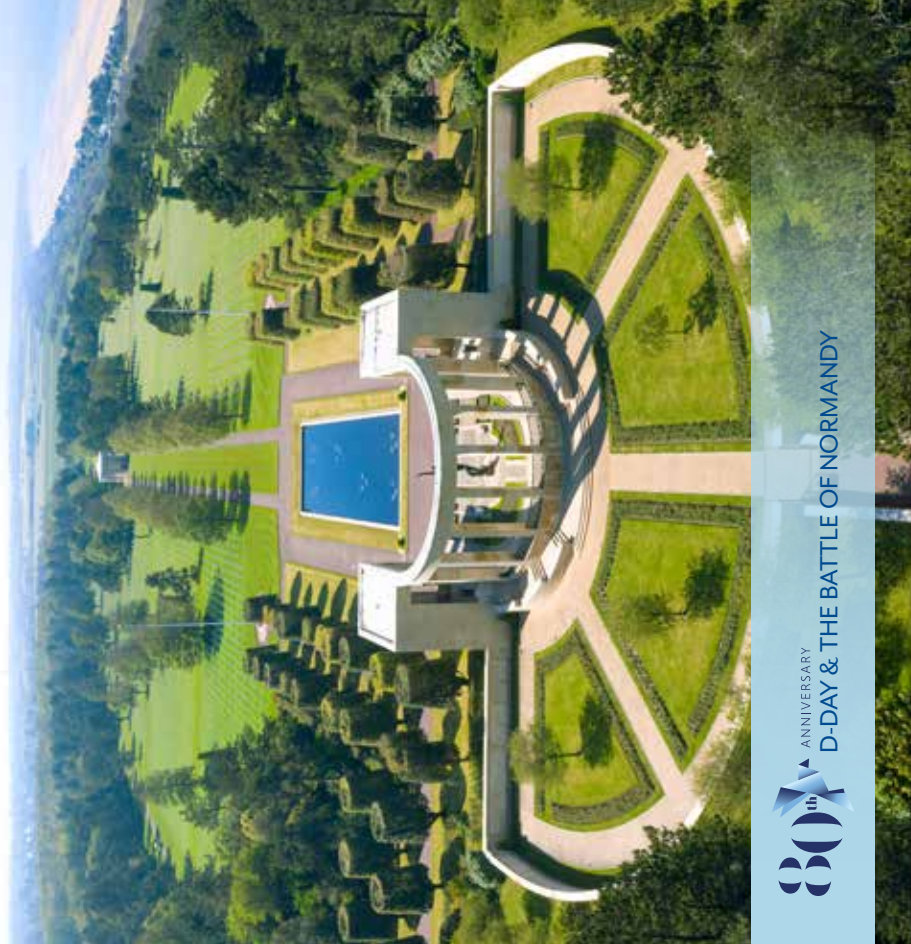
