Paddle beside gliding sea turtles, snorkel with playful sea lions, and hike among colonies of nesting seabirds. There will also be plenty of chances to spot marine life–like leaping dolphins and diving blue-footed boobies from the ship's expansive decks.

Nathaniel Dominy Charles Hansen Professor of Anthropology

Professor Dominy is an anthropologist and evolutionary biologist. His research program pivots around the feeding behaviors and evolution of primates, but it draws direct inspiration from the Galápagos, namely the studies of Peter and Rosemary Grant. Professor Dominy has published more than 140 articles, most of which are based on primatological fieldwork in the rainforests of eastern and central Africa. He has received grants or fellowships from the National Science Foundation, Packard Foundation, and National Geographic Society, among other agencies; and he is an elected fellow of the American Association for the Advancement of Science, Explorers Club, and Dartmouth's

Society of Fellows. Like Charles Darwin, Professor Dominy is an elected fellow of the Royal Geographic Society and Linnean Society of London.

His lectures will focus on the origins of new species as well as the principles of natural and sexual selection. At least one lecture will focus on fire and human language, which, for Darwin, were the two greatest touchstones of human evolution.



Voyage Itinerary

Pack a lifetime of adventure into one action-filled week. Explore the legendary Galápagos Islands with daily opportunities for walks, hikes, kayaking, stand-up paddleboarding, and snorkeling.



DAY 1: GUAYAQUIL, ECUADOR

Arrive in Guayaquil and transfer to the Hotel del Parque, a tranquil haven set in a restored 19th-century building.

DAY 2: GUAYAQUIL/ GALÁPAGOS/EMBARK

This morning, fly to Baltra in the center of Galápagos, a little world unto itself in the tropical Pacific Ocean. Get to know your naturalists as we begin our



exploration of the islands and their diverse wildlife. (B,L,D)

DAYS 3-6: EXPLORING THE GALÁPAGOS

Our expedition begins and ends in Baltra and includes visits to a careful selection of diverse islands. Our itinerary offers an optimal balance of wildlife, landscapes, and experiences. All itineraries are subject to Galápagos National Park regulations. Here is a sample of islands we may visit during our expedition. (B,L,D Daily)

BARTOLOMÉ

Climb the steps to the summit of this 300-foot volcanic wonderland for stunning views. Explore, swim, and snorkel from the beach. Catch a glimpse of Galápagos penguins, one of the world's rarest.

SAN CRISTÓBAL

Search for red-footed boobies and the endemic mockingbird and lava lizard–found only on this easternmost island. Explore Baquerizo Moreno, where sea lion colonies thrive in the middle of town.

ESPAÑOLA

In this birding paradise, see swallow-tailed gulls, Española mockingbirds and, seasonally, the world's only population of waved albatross. Keep an eye out for vividly colored marine iguanas, and walk amid sea lions on a white-sand beach.

FLOREANA

Follow a trail along a rose-pink lagoon sometimes frequented by flamingos. Visit Post Office Bay, founded by 18th-century whalers, on this mysterious island with an intriguing human history.

SANTA CRUZ

Explore Puerto Ayora, the largest town and headquarters of both the Charles Darwin Research Station and Galápagos National Park. Head to the lush, green highlands to see giant tortoises roaming in the wild.

DAY 7: GALÁPAGOS/DISEMBARK/GUAYAQUIL

After breakfast, disembark the ship and fly to Guayaquil. (B)

DAY 8: GUAYAQUIL

Stay and relax or take an early flight home today. (B)

OPTIONAL POST-VOYAGE EXTENSION:

Explore Ecuador's beautifully preserved colonial capital and Otavalo in the Andean highlands.


